## PRESIDENT PATRICK'S BOARD TALK

#### **Our inaugural Chess Triathlon!**

On Saturday, 10<sup>th</sup> December, 2016, Ballarat Chess Club held its 1<sup>st</sup> Triathlon Chess Tournament in the Hooper Room at Ballarat Mechanics Institute. The idea for this unusual event, which combines all three time controls in the one tournament, came from Jasan Barnett, who was also the principal organiser of the event.

The tournament was a 6 round Swiss, with 2 rounds of Blitz (5 minutes), 2 rounds of Rapid (25 minutes + 10 seconds per move), and 2 rounds of Classical (60 minutes + 30 seconds per move). It attracted an excellent entry of 15 players, headed by Ballarat Champion James Watson. It also included no less than 5 juniors.

Round 1 was the first Blitz, giving the youngsters a chance to score an upset early in the day. Most games went according to seeding, but young Leonard Goodison (13) scored a great win, with the Black pieces, against Michael Tausz (6), a sharp and dangerous attacking player.

Round 2 was the first Rapid, and the heavy hitters began meeting each other. Top seed James Watson faced 4<sup>th</sup> seed Rob Loveband, and he seemed on course for a smooth win, until an endgame stumble enabled Rob to escape with a draw. Patrick Cook (5) met the wildly imaginative Harrison Harrison (2), and Patrick appeared to have the better of it; but an oversight in a wild and woolly position gave Harrison the chance to end the game in an instant. He didn't miss! Leonard Goodison continued his good start with a win over Jack Coulter (15),

while Coen Johnson (10), back at the Club after a few years away, heaped more misery on Michael Tausz. Round 3 was the first Classical game, and Harrison taught young Leonard a lesson; Rob Loveband fell to Jamie Brotheridge (2); Patrick Cook beat James Watson after James unwisely declined the Drawmaster's draw offer to become the latest victim of "Patrick's Curse"!; and James Eyre (7) was unable to overcome the tenacious defence of Caitlin Barnett (9).

So at the halfway mark Harrison and Jamie led with a perfect 3/3.

Round 4 was the second Blitz, and the two leaders met each other, with Harrison scoring a surprise win over speed King Jamie to be sole leader. The other games all went according to expectations.

Round 5 was the second Rapid and Harrison was unable to maintain his momentum, falling to James Watson. Patrick joined the lead with a nice technical win over his old rival Jamie, although Jamie's resignation in a rook and pawn ending seemed premature; and Rob kept in range after defeating young Caitlin.

Round 6, the final round, was the second Classical game, and Rob defeated Harrison in a lively and interesting game that featured a "pseudo-blunder", to be in contention for the title, depending on other results. James Watson overcame Michael to join Rob on 4.5/6, leaving Patrick a chance at glory if he could put aside his penchant for draws and defeat Coen with the Black pieces. Patrick's experience and strong endgame technique prevailed in a long game, and so Patrick Cook, to the surprise of many (especially himself!) won the tournament and Gold Medal to become the Club's first Ironman!! Caitlin Barnett, to the surprise of no one, won the Silver Medal for best Reserves player.

Despite the long day, the tournament was deemed a great success, with all the players enjoying the friendly and social atmosphere of the inaugural Ballarat Chess Club Triathlon.






